MEET THE NEW TEAM @ AHEAD




issues and people affected by homelessness. Their primary project is **Care & Share** which provides:

- Over 2500 meals per year.
- Drop-in access for over 50 people per week.
- A furniture service for people coming out of homelessness (over 150 pick-ups and deliveries per year).

and much more ...

..The core event each week is the drop-in facility where an average of 50 people per week can access 13 different social care, health care and financial services on a one-stop-shop basis. C & S also provides a range of other services including a breakfast club, skills activity groups (knitting, baking, cooking, photography etc.) and provides access to IT and formal qualifications. C & S is a central component of South Ayrshire's alcohol and drug strategy and implements the Scottish Government Recovery Oriented System of Care (ROSC). C & S won the COSLA Gold Award in 2009 for its innovative practice.

The Wallacetown community builder has been going along to care and share since October 2019 and has met so many wonderful people, the work that the staff and volunteers do is admirable, the community builder looks forward to going along each week to connect with the many services and meet the people old and new. Here are a few of the faces behind care and share.



KAREN ALEXANDER

Karen is a resident in Dalmilling, she is a part time Peer Worker at Care & Share, having first attended 12 years ago, before successfully completing the Peer Worker Programme through the Alcohol and Drug Partnership (ADP). Care & Share is close to Karen's heart and has been a big part of her life journey; when she was studying her SVQ Level 3 and having went to the group on placement, she believed in the work so much so that when there was no employment opportunity at the end, she continued on as a volunteer. Soon afterwards, funds were raised to provide a job

opportunity and Karen was over the moon to secure a paid position.

Speaking with the Community Builders, it was clear Karen is proud of her achievement and has fought hard to get to where she is today; she spoke honestly and openly of the challenges she faced, and still continues to face, from having become addicted to drugs to finding recovering, from raising her young children on her own to juggling college work, from volunteering at activities in Dalmilling to securing employment. Life isn't always easy for anyone; she says "mental health has a massive impact".

Karen spoke so passionately about how she is able to use her experience, knowledge and skills to help others in the community, telling us she "always wanted to help others but never thought I'd achieve it".

It's hard to see where he finds time to get a day off, but this is what Billy loves, he loves keeping busy and being able to help others.

Billy says, "I believe anyone can change if they want it! There's a big supportive community around here".

WHITLETTS VICTORIA



HAVE WHITLETTS VICTORIA PLAYED THEIR LAST EVER JUNIOR MATCH?

No, we're not talking about the demise of Ayr's Junior Football Club but rather the next stage in its' development and a move onto a new venture in Scottish football. The advances the Vics have made in recent years will continue but with football in Scotland having been suspended indefinitely due to the outbreak of the Coronavirus and the likelihood of Vics joining a brand new league in Scottish football next season, Whitletts' recent 3-2 win over Arthurlie at Dunterlie Park may well be the last match the Dam Park side have played in junior football.



Since the Vics played their first ever match, a 2-2 draw with Ayr Newton Rovers at the Recreation Ground on 12th August 1944, the club have played in the junior leagues. But now there is the real prospect of Whitletts joining a new league that is being formed for next season which will form part of Scottish football's recently established pyramid system. Talks are at a very advanced stage between the Scottish Football Association (SFA), West Region Juniors, Lowland League and the East and South of Scotland Leagues to create a new West of Scotland Football League. This league would sit at the sixth tier of Scottish football, below the four divisions in the SPFL and the Lowland League and on a par with the East of Scotland and the South of Scotland Leagues and it could be in place for the start of the new football season. This, allied to the proposed new stadium for the Club and its' charity, Vics in the Community (VIC), could lead to the Club applying for the SFA's National Club License (NCL). The NCL is the criteria that the SFA have laid down for clubs to become members of the games national governing body and would involve a minimum criteria for administrative and stadium requirements. Once clubs obtain their NCL, they would become members of the SFA and be eligible to play in the Scottish Cup! Not only that but if Whitletts were to win the West of Scotland League, with a NCL they would be eligible to gain promotion to the Lowland League and then they would only be one promotion away from playing in the SPFL! Now all of that may sound a bit fanciful but as Chairman John Dalton highlighted, that is the level of the Clubs ambition. "Whitletts Victoria have made some tremendous advances in recent years, none more so than with the creation of our own charity, Vics in the Community and all the fantastic work that they have done in the North Ayr Community" said John. "We are also close to completing a deal with South Ayrshire Council that would see the Club return to Whitletts and play in a redeveloped community football stadium behind Whitletts Activity Centre, which would become a new home for the Club and VIC. We will be working hard in the months ahead to gain the funding to ensure that our proposed new home will meet the requirements of the NCL to enable us to be able to play in the Scottish Cup and who knows, maybe one day we'll play a major SPFL club in the Scottish Cup." But as John explained that 'dream' may not be as far

fetched as it seems. "This season Broxburn Athletic played St.Mirren in a Scottish Cup tie in front of 5,000 spectators at St.Mirren Park. Yet just over 4 years ago, Whitletts defeated the West Lothian club 3-1 in a Scottish Junior Cup tie at their own Albyn Park ground. Since Broxburn joined the pyramid by becoming a member of the East of Scotland League a couple of seasons ago they have made tremendous advances, so



why cant Whitletts make the same progress?"

Meanwhile the outbreak of the Coronavirus has hit junior football with all Whitletts matches postponed until further notice, so with a move to a new league set up looking inevitable, after 75 years, Whitletts Victoria may well have played their last ever junior fixture. With a good number of new and experienced members the CCA is looking forward to what it can achieve in the future for the benefit of their community.
