Notes

1. Common assaults and breaches of the peace have seen an increase. Drugs possession has also increased on the same period last year. However, the detection rate remains high with regard to these crime types.
2. Housebreakings in the Ayr West ward have increased slightly on the same period last year. Vehicle crime has decreased with none reported this past month, however residents must remain vigilant, as there have been some opportunist thefts around Ayr to houses, sheds and cars in recent months.
3. Local police will continue to run a high visibility road safety campaign throughout February until early March to deter speeding and hopefully reduce collisions and the number of people injured or killed on our roads which has unfortunately seen a rise. The rise in drink drivers is a concern and the detection increase may be linked to the additional resources deployed to this road safety campaign.

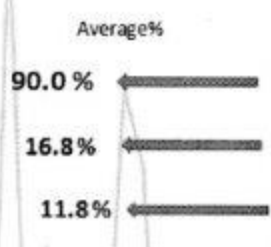
