- This report provides Ayr West September 2017 & 2018 crime figures for comparison purposes.
- From the Ayr West perspective, drugs offences, housebreakings and assaults have all decreased on the same period last year, but the detection rate remains high with regard to these crime types.
- Housebreakings in the Ayr West ward have decreased significantly on the same period last year.
- 4. Car crime have slightly increased in Ayr West during this period. Residents should be highly vigilant regarding home security and leaving items visible in their cars and ensuring central locking systems are engaged correctly. Anyone seen acting suspiciously should be reported to police immediately.
- 5. Drink driving detection remained static and our officers are continuing to hold both covert and high visibility patrols for road traffic crimes.
